PHASE 2 AND 3

WHAT IS PROJECT DOVE: Project DOVE empowers young people to become informed citizens and active participants in the political process. DOVE is a grant-funded program through the National Cooperation on Community Service, which focuses on three major areas:

1. Registering young adult, first time voters.
2. Training and encouraging youth to give testimonies during the legislative session.
3. Training young adults to have position as board members.

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN PHASE 2 AND 3: The second and third phase of our program will begin in January. This phase will be focused on training young adults to give their testimonies concerning the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum during the legislative session. We will also be training young adults on the skills needed to serve on boards as board members.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE: Young adults with disabilities who are interested in becoming an active citizen in their state and general political process.

REQUIREMENTS: Participants will be required to complete 40 hours on this project.
